

PROFESSIONALISM IN HEALTHCARE



Developing educational materials to facilitate professionalism teaching during clinical attachments

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Professionalism is a core component of most UK medical school undergraduate curricula. Our local faculty development process identified a need for additional materials to support professionalism teaching. Ideas for topics were generated through faculty development workshops. We designed a series of fact sheets, podcasts and modular teaching packages to suit a range of learning/teaching styles and educational scenarios.

Podcasts

Expert clinicians discuss their approach to various professionalism challenges in the real world. Topics include consent, capacity, confidentiality, social media and difficult and distressing consultations.

Teaching Packages

Tutorial packages covering topics such as 'giving driving advice', have been written and integrated into existing clinical attachment timetables.

Fact Sheet posters

Fact sheet posters were designed summarising key information drawing upon published literature and regulatory guidance. These were distributed electronically and physical copies posted around learning environments.
