



He was also the founding Programme Director of the Graduate Certificate of Simulation Based Clinical Education at the University of Edinburgh.

His new role is as the Simulation Convenor at the University of Canberra's School of Nursing, Midwifery, and Public Health. Nathan is a regular contributor to national and European simulation bodies and conferences, is an Executive Committee member of the Association of Simulation Practice in Healthcare (ASPiH) and consults internationally on simulation design and educational debriefing

PROF DENIS FISCHBACHER-SMITH

Research Professor of Risk and Resilience, University of Glasgow


Professor Fischbacher-Smith was Deputy Head of the Business School between 2012-21. He is a graduate of the Universities of Manchester, Glasgow, St Andrews, Glasgow Caledonian, Derby, the CNAA, and the Open University. He holds Batchelor's degrees in Geography/Environmental Science (BEd) (Manchester) and Science (BSc) (Open), Masters degrees in Pollution Control (MSc), Applied Psychology (MSc), Public Health (MPH) (Manchester) Psychology in Forensic Settings (MSc) (GCU), Management (MBA) (CNAA), Ergonomics (MSc) (Derby), Terrorism Studies (MLitt) (St Andrews) and War Studies (MLitt) (Glasgow). He holds a DLitt in Crisis Management (Glasgow) and a PhD in Science and Technology Policy (Manchester). He is a Chartered Security Professional (CSyP), a Chartered Psychologist (CPsychol), a Chartered Ergonomist & Human Factors Specialist (C.ErgHF), a Chartered Fellow of the Institute of Personnel and Development (FCIPD), and a Chartered Manager (CMgr). In addition, he is a Companion of the Chartered Management Institute (CCMI), a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences (FAcSS), a Principal Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (PFHEA), a Fellow of the British Academy of Management, and a Fellow of the Emergency Planning Society.

He has held professorial appointments at the Liverpool John Moores, Durham, Sheffield, and Liverpool Universities. He has also been a visiting professor at the Universities of Kobe (Japan), Innsbruck (Austria), San Diego State (USA), Edge Hill (UK) and at the Crichton Institute. He was the Director of Liverpool Business School (LJMU) and the founding director of the University of Liverpool Management School.

Outside of his academic activities, Professor Fischbacher-Smith has been a director of HARM Consulting and CSC Ltd, as well as a non-executive director of JMU Services, Mersey Regional Ambulance Service, St Helens RLFC and Aintree University Hospital NHS Trust. He was seconded to Scottish Government and Police Scotland for work around resilience and counter-terrorism and he also worked extensively with Sefton Borough Council on work relating to organisational design and child protection. In terms of policy development, he was a member of the Ministerial Advisory Committee that produced "An Organisation with a Memory" for the Department of Health (England and Wales) in 2000 and an expert advisor to the Grenfell Inquiry in 2020.

"The good, the bad and the ugly of patient/family support groups"



His son had Sydenham's chorea in 2014, which led to him to become Chair of the Sydenham's chorea association, one of only 2 support groups in the world for this condition.

Emma Stokes PhD PT is a Fellow of Trinity College Dublin and was appointed to serve as the Vice President for Global Engagement in 2021. She qualified as a physiotherapist/physical therapist in 1990 and has been an educator for over 2 decades. In 2018 she moved to the Middle East to set up the academic department of Physiotherapy & Rehabilitation Science at Qatar University and led an international team who developed an innovative and future-oriented curriculum for the first program educating physical therapists in Qatar. From 2015, she has served as the President of World Physiotherapy, working closely with the staff and board, and the wider global physiotherapy community, leading a transformation of the organisation. With a small group of committed colleagues, she was instrumental in the foundation of the Global Rehabilitation Alliance which was a precursor of the WHO World Rehabilitation Alliance. She has taught and lectured in over 40 countries in the world.
